7. Penal Provision and Incentives

Imposition of Fines to Offenders

Non-Segregated Waste	No collection of waste + the head of the unit will be reprimanded		

Mechanism:

*All violators will be apprehended by the deputized enforcers. IDs of student violators will be confiscated and turned over to the security officers for the issuance of temporary gate pass which is valid for two (2) days. The confiscated IDs shall be turned over by the security officer to the ESWM Secretariat for record and billing and collection of fines or community service.

Mechanism:

*In the case of employees, business stall operators, tricycle drivers and outsiders the name of the violators will be reported to the security officer or to the ESWM Secretariat for recording, billing and collection of fines or community service. In case of refusal to pay or conduct community service, it will be reported to the University President for proper action.

*Community service will be supervised and monitored by the ESWM personnel to the designated places in the University.

Incentives

*At the end of the calendar year, fifty percent (50%) of the collected fines will be given to the apprehending unit/organization or individual.

8. Research and Public Information

a. Collaborative research in waste management, waste disposal, waste segregation, technology waste (e-waste), food waste, green environment, ecological sustainability other related studies.

b. Paper presentation (Local and International)

c. Paper publication (Scopus, World of Science and other CHED recognized journals)

9. Waste Recycling, Composting and Other Related Projects

a. Recycling of wastes will be done involving the faculty and students.

b. An Eco-learning Park/Garden will be established

c. Composting Projects (Business and Auxiliary Services)

10. Disposal and Marketing of Products

a. Disposal and Marketing shall be coordinated to the Business and Auxiliary Services

b. Disposal of e-wastes shall be coordinated to the Supply Office.

c. Residual wastes will be stored temporarily in the TAU MRF and weekly, it shall be disposed in Capas Sanitary Landfill thru Camiling.

11. Enforcement and monitoring of ESWM Policies

a. Security Force, SSC and CSC Officers, Deans, Chairs, Unit/Office Heads, and ESWM Team are deputized to enforce and monitor.
