I am writing to you this letter to seek your permission in conducting a training-workshop for the faculty of Tarlac Agricultural University (TAU) on the integration of inclusion in curriculum and instruction. The event will be held in the Farmers Training Center on June 26, 2024 at 8:00-11:00 in the morning. This is in collaboration with Peace Corps Philippines, TAU College of Arts and Sciences (CAS), Gender and Development Office (GAD), External Linkages and International Affairs (ELIA), and the Student Inclusion Unit of the Office of Student Services and Development (OSSD).

The guest speaker will be Coleen Thereasa Connor, a Peace Corps volunteer who has done extensive work on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion in the Workplace as well as Ethical and Inclusive Leadership. She has decades of experience in training related to inclusion in the classroom and advocacy. Attached herewith is a copy of her curriculum vitae for your perusal.

This lecture and workshop will be fruitful in raising awareness about the challenges and issues associated with these topics. Furthermore, it will be greatly beneficial to the staff and faculty here at TAU as it will expand the global connections of TAU and promote potential further areas of research and collaboration for faculty with global partners.

3. To help TAU student organizations integrate concepts of inclusion into their programs and activities.


4. To foster bonds and create camaraderie among students, faculty, and staff at TAU






